## Celebrations of Learning (CoL)

We will continue to gather as a school every Friday from 11:45am to 12:15pm for *Celebration of Learning (CoL)* this year.

We will alternate between a few different formats for CoLs. Some will be “community activities” in which the whole school joins together in an activity that can be enjoyed by all ages of BAIS students. We had a cooperative scavenger hunt this past Friday for our first CoL of the year.

Other Fridays we will have “Class Share” CoLs, in which parents/guardians are invited to attend as student representatives from all grades briefly share what they have been learning in their different classes. **The first “Class Share” CoL will be this coming Friday, September 15th**—we hope to see many of you there! The next “Class Share” CoL will be Friday, September 29th. (September 22 will be a holiday so there will be no CoL that week.)

We will also have CoLs, like last year, that feature one class sharing a project or other demonstration of their learning. These will begin later in the year, with the middle/high school class leading the CoL on Friday, December 8th.

## Character Education at BAIS

We have initiated a schoolwide Character Education program at BAIS this year, with specific values emphasized in each month of the school year. The values we are highlighting this month are **responsibility** and **accountability**. We encourage you to use these terms and discuss their meaning with your children at home. Here is the full list of values we will be promoting throughout the year, with our definitions:

### August/September

**Responsibility:** acting as someone who can be trusted to do what is needed and what is expected of you

**Accountability:** holding yourself responsible for completing the tasks expected of you

### October

**Kindness:** being gentle and helpful to others

**Generosity:** giving and sharing what you have for the good of others

### November

**Honesty:** telling the truth

**Integrity:** being fair, honest, and true to the values you believe in

### December/January

**Courage:** being brave to do something even if it is difficult or scary for you

**Hope:** believing that good things will happen

### February

**Perseverance:** to try and try again even if something is difficult

**Resilience:** bouncing back and overcoming obstacles

### March

**Compassion:** making an effort to help people in need

**Empathy:** being able to understand and feel what another person is feeling

### April

**Open-mindedness:** considering different ideas or opinions

**Acceptance:** including all people and appreciating their differences

### May

**Patience:** the ability to remain calm and deal with a long wait or with a frustrating situation

**Understanding:** being willing and able to understand other people's behavior and forgive them if you don't agree with their behavior

### June

**Reflection:** careful thought about something related to your own feelings or actions

**Awareness:** knowing what is happening around you and inside you



## After-School Activities

**After-school activities will begin on Monday, September 18th!** After-school activities are open to all BAIS students in kindergarten and up, and are held on Mondays and Thursdays from 3:15 to 4:15pm. Ms. Leah Woldman, our after-school activities coordinator, has been working hard alongside our teaching staff to prepare a schedule of excellent activities including swimming, wood carving, sign language, pottery, cross stitch, African drumming, and much more. The sign-up form will go home tomorrow (Monday) in both hard copy and email. **It is very important that you submit your sign-up form promptly** so that Ms. Leah can finalize the plans for all activities. (We'll need to cancel activities if not enough students sign up, and we can only offer swimming if we can secure enough offers of transportation and assistance.)
