beginning of an ongoing relationship with DR. Bateman, and we are happy that he will be able to follow up and continue to provide assistance to our teachers.

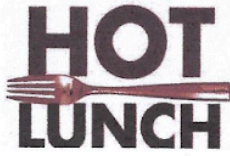
