# **National Honor Society Inductions**



Today we had the honor of inducting **Simon Badjie**, **India Pearson Davis**, and **Fatoumatta Sillah** into the BAIS chapter of the National Honor Society (NHS). Simon, India, and Fatoumatta join **Teju James-Akinsulure**, our returning member from last year. Founded in 1921, the NHS is one of the oldest, largest, and most widely recognized cocurricular student organizations in American and international high schools, with 1.4 million members.

The National Honor Society is not merely an honor roll. It is the preeminent high school recognition organization is US high schools and American international schools worldwide. The purpose of the NHS is to create enthusiasm for scholarship, to recognize outstanding students, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote leadership, and to develop character in the students of secondary schools. Here at BAIS we have always emphasized the importance of character, leadership, and service, in addition to academics. Inductees were selected by our NHS Faculty Council based on criteria established by the National Honor Society organization. Our NHS and NJHS sponsor is **Ms. Amal Alfa**. Ms. Amal puts considerable energy into the NHS, and I appreciate her efforts.

Membership in the NHS chapters is an honor bestowed upon a student by a Faculty Council and is based on the four pillars of NHS: scholarship, character, leadership, and service. Once selected, members have the responsibility to continue to demonstrate these qualities. Membership in the NHS is one of the most impressive things that students can add to their college applications. In addition, last year the NHS awarded over \$2,000,000 in college scholarships to over 600 applicants, including some from American/international schools.

The NHS is sponsored by the National Association of Secondary School Principals. The NASSP also sponsors the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) for middle schools. In the spring we will have another induction ceremony for new NJHS members, as well as any new qualifying students for the NHS.

#### **Dr. David Bateman Returns to BAIS**

I am excited to announce Dr. David Bateman will be returning to BAIS the week of April 13-17 to conduct staff development training for all of our staff in the area of special needs and learning support. You may recall that Dr. Bateman was with us for three days back in February of this year. Feedback from our faculty was extremely positive; all though he was one of the best presenters they had seen.

Dr. Bateman is regarded in the United States as somewhat of a guru in the area of special needs and learning support for students. He is a former professor at Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania in the Department of Educational Leadership and Special Education where he taught courses on special education law, assessment, and IEP implementation/development. Dr. Bateman has been a classroom teacher of students with learning disabilities, behavior disorders, intellectual disability, and hearing impairments. He has recently co-authored the following books: A Principal's Guide to Special Education (4th ed.), Developing Educational Meaningful and Legally Sound IEPs, and Current Trends and Issues in Special Education, A Teacher's Guide to Special Education, Special Education Law Case Studies, and Special Education Leadership: Building Effective Programming in Schools. Dr. Bateman will present workshops for our faculty, visit classes, and work with individual teachers on how to more effectively meet the needs of students with special needs.

Shortly after Dr. Kim Seefried was hired back in February, she and Dr. Bateman began collaborating, so they already have a working relationship, and Dr. Bateman already is familiar with some of our classes from his previous visit. He also continued to meet virtually with our staff during the spring.

Dr. Bateman's visit is made possible by an increase in our grant from the U.S. State Department. Meeting the needs of students with special needs has become an area of increased emphasis by the State Department, and we are grateful to be able to benefit from that. We will continue to make that our highest priority when requesting grant assistance. We are so grateful for the assistance we receive from the Office of Overseas Schools back in Washington, and also everyone at our own Embassy here in Banjul
